Social isolation is a growing epidemic in our schools and across the United States. Young people who are isolated can become victims of bullying, violence, and/or depression. Many then pull further away from society, struggle with learning and social development, and/or choose to hurt themselves or others as a result.

This is why we are bringing Sandy Hook Promise's *Start with Hello* program to *Felix J. Appleby Elementary School* for TK-8th grades.

Start with Hello is an age-appropriate training that raises awareness and educates students about social isolation and how to create a connected and inclusive classroom, school, and community.

We encourage you to use the *Start with Hello* introduction presentation and to talk with your students about the importance of being "upstanders" and looking out for one another. Please look for a calendar of schoolwide events and activities that will take place during the program's "Kick-Off Week" (September 21st through September 25th).
